TAFE NSW - Illawarra Institute recognised for excellence in trade skills training

Illawarra Institute has been recognised as a leading registered training organisation with a Three Gold Star Rating for its Certificate III courses in Carpentry, Shopfitting & Detailed Joinery, Painting and Decorating and Bricklaying/Blocklaying at Wollongong Campus.

The Star Rating Scheme is administered by the Institute for Trade Skills Excellence and recognises excellence in trade skills training among TAFE and other Registered Training Organisations.

Dianne Murray from TAFE NSW - Illawarra Institute said that receiving the Three Gold Star Rating was recognition of the high quality of teaching delivered across a number of their courses.

“The recognition we have received validates our position as a leading choice in training across the building and construction industry,” said Ms Murray.

The Star Rating Scheme identifies the very best training providers, industry by industry and enables employers, career counsellors, potential students, and parents to distinguish excellence in trade training by evaluating training providers.

“Employers can be confident knowing their apprentices are receiving the highest quality vocational education and training at Illawarra Institute,” added Ms Murray

Registered Training Organisations which apply receive either a: One Gold Star; Two Gold Star; or Three Gold Star Rating within industry areas, to indicate that they have achieved excellent results for their students.

The Star Rating Scheme focuses on the following eight areas of skill shortage:

- Automotive
- Building and Construction

- Electrical
- Hospitality and Personal Services
- Manufacturing
- Metals and Engineering
- Mineral Resources
- Rural and Farming

Evaluations are carried out against three broad criteria that were developed in partnership with the industry.

The evaluation process includes an initial self evaluation by the relevant training provider, followed by a site visit to those organisations who demonstrate potential to achieve a One Gold Star, Two Gold Star or Three Gold Star rating.

Brian Wexham, Chief Executive Officer of The Institute for Trade Skills Excellence said that the Star Rating Scheme gives students comfort that they are choosing the most appropriate training provider.

“One of the biggest concerns when choosing a course is whether or not it will get people the job they want when they complete the course. Thanks to the Star Ratings Scheme, prospective students and employers now have a credible source to validate a course.

“The Scheme aims to recognise high performing registered training providers such as Illawarra Institute, and assist them to understand exactly what their clients want from their training.

“The Star Rating Scheme is an industry driven initiative and has been developed by The Institute for Trade Skills Excellence and industry to provide a platform that will deliver the vocational training outcomes required to meet industry needs” said Mr Wexham.

“We found the process to be a valuable addition to our own internal quality processes and regular self-assessment work, and a great mechanism to maintain our focus on providing excellence for our customers,” said Ms Murray.

“During this critical skills shortage period, we welcome initiatives that seek to identify and meet specific industry needs - such as the Star Rating Scheme. They help us ensure that our apprentices and trainees have the right skills to contribute to industry and the region’s economy,” said Ms Murray.
