TAFE receives two reasons to celebrate

TAFE NSW Riverina celebrated a double win at the weekend.

Graduate Tiffany Burdack has won a \$7000 overseas scholarship and the institute has been recognised as a leader in engineering trade training.

Ms Burdack will represent Australia in an international study tour of Britain after she won the Frank Mansell Award for Agriculture.

"I'm really interested in getting into rural finance and agri-marketing so I'm planning to visit an agricultural institute as well as some studs to see how things are done in the UK," Ms Burdack said.

"I'd like to spend a month in Ireland, one month in Scotland and one month in England."

TAFE Riverina is also celebrating after it received a gold star rating from the Institute of Trade Skills Excellence.

Riverina Institute's director of educational delivery Graeme Stuchbery said the gold star was acknowledgment of the high quality teaching.
